How does the duty roster work?

These are the expectations for families on duty:

Canteen The duty families are to run the canteen all day, starting from 8:30 (winter) 7:30 (summer). There are instructions provided in the canteen area, and one of the canteen supervisors will be available at the start of the day to deliver food, get things going, and answer any questions. There is usually some time during the day for families to share staying inside, and being outside watching the rally, and they should roster this between themselves. It is usually "all hands on deck" just prior to and during the busy lunch period.

Outdoors Setup Duty families are responsible for setting up and packing up at the rally, and this means that one parent needs to be outside most of the day, starting from 8:30 (winter) 7:30 (summer). If there is more help needed during setup, the duty family should organise a call over the loud speaker for more help. There will usually be a supervisor available to provide direction (usually Jim or Roz).

Canteen end of day Duty families are responsible for the clean up of canteen, toilets and club rooms at the end of the day. Roster families also need to take home that day's garbage as we don't have a garbage collection at the club.

Outdoors Pickup Duty families are responsible for organising the pack up of outdoors areas at the end of the rally day. However ALL FAMILIES are required to assist them. Stay in touch with instructors and with the DC to find out when rings can be packed up, and put announcements over the loud speaker to get other families involved if needed.

Changes to the roster?

As we no longer have a specific person organising roster, it is YOUR responsibility to organise a swap if needed, and to let Wendy Wright know so she can change the information in the newsletter/web site. The information that we have published above is to the best of our knowledge - if you don't tell us about changes, we won't know to make the change.

End of day pack up

The pack up of equipment in each ring/arena is to be done by ALL FAMILIES at the rally on the day.

If everyone pitches in, the ring pack up can be done very quickly - more hands make light work!

Welcome to Winter! The cold and the rain has arrived. This is the time of year that horse owners hate; the daylight hours are limited, it seems to be raining every time you actually can find time to go for a ride, and your horse has just rolled in the muddiest patch of the paddock five minutes before you pulled him out. It's in Winter that horse owners must show their devotion. There is more of the hard stuff: rugging, feeding, washing, brushing, and less of the fun stuff. If you truly love your horse, this is when it shows.

Rugs must be removed at least once a week, and horses thoroughly brushed, even if the horse is "turned out" (unridden). Feet should be picked out and trimmed regularly. Horses must still be inspected daily to ensure they have not injured themselves or are ill. Be on the look out for mud fever, coughs, thrush of the frog and viruses.

For those who are planning to keep their horses in work over Winter, the competition season has not ended with Yeringberg. Later in this newsletter you'll find some info about the Interzone at Yarrambat. This is the next big event for Gr 3 and 4 Horse Trials riders. If you decide to enter, make sure both you and your horse are properly prepared. Ideally that means entering at least one more event before the Interzone and training over at one more X-country course.

Welcome to all new members on the committee joining us for the first time and also to those taking on new roles. We look forward to a busy year.

Our special thanks to the departing members of the committee, especially Roz, who was a fabulous, enthusiastic DC. It was particularly generous of her to continue in the role in the second half of the year. We look forward to seeing you around still Roz.

INTERZONE TEAMS HORSE TRIALS

27TH AND 28TH JULY AT YARRAMBAT PC

Hi all, just a short note to encourage riders to consider entering the Interzone Comp coming up. This is a State Level event for Grade 3 and Grade 4 riders. It is a Horse Trials event, much like Yeringberg, but conducted over two days. Usually Dressage is on the Saturday and Showjumping and Cross Country are on the Sunday. Last year Lauren and Sarah Jane entered and did really well. You send in your individual entry (\$70 – form on PCAV website) and the zone will place you in a team of four NMZ riders (all Gr3 or all Gr4). They pick the teams based roughly on your Yeringberg results. Like Yeringberg, the best 3 scores count for a team result. There are no individual prizes. It's a great chance to get to know riders from other clubs in the zone. If there is enough interest, we will try to organise a training day over the course.

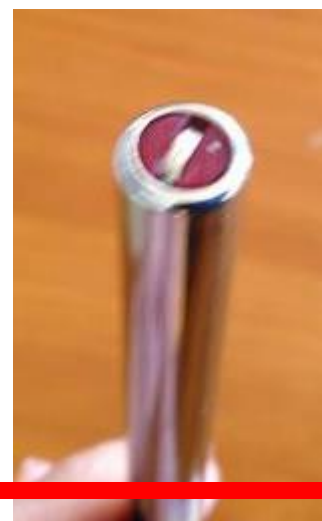

Zone Horse Trials - Yeringberg



Forty-two teams of riders from across the North Metro zone came together on May 19th to compete for the zone's Teams Horse Trials.

Teams comprise of either 3 or 4 riders, and are split into two

sections (each competing for

a shield) of 21 teams each. There are specific requirements for the

numbers of riders at grade levels to comprise a team.



Ten Mooroolbark riders competed at the North Metro Zone Horse Trials at Yeringberg on May 19th. Because of the requirement to have riders from specific grades, our riders were paired with riders from other clubs to make a total of 4 composite teams ... all of our teams did really well, with two teams placing third (one in each section), one 10th and the other 12th.

All riders did well, with some placing individually (although no individual prizes are awarded), and all 10 of our riders making it around the cross country course without elimination. Well done!

Horse Fact Sheets – Clipping

One of the main reasons for clipping is to avoid excess sweating and subsequent loss of condition, another purpose of clipping is to aid the comfort of the horse during the winter months. The longer and coarser winter coat usually starts to grow in Autumn. This extra insulation causes the horse to sweat more during work, which if not dried off may cause chills. A clipped horse is also easier to clean and groom.

Styles of clipping

Three common clipping styles are illustrated. The darker brown is the unclipped hair.

The more hair that is removed the less tolerant the horse will be to the cold and wet, and the more the horse will need to be stabled and/or well rugged. Immediately after the horse is exercised a rug should be applied to avoid chills.

The blanket clip is similar to the hunter clip only the hair on the back area is left to provide a little more protection for the kidney and rump areas.

The trace clip leaves most of the exposed areas of the horse unclipped.

You will notice in the illustrations that the hair is removed from the 'midriff' area of the horse, these areas are the most prone to the accumulation of sweat.

'Rugging Up'

Whichever clip is used we must compensate for what hair is removed by 'rugging up'.

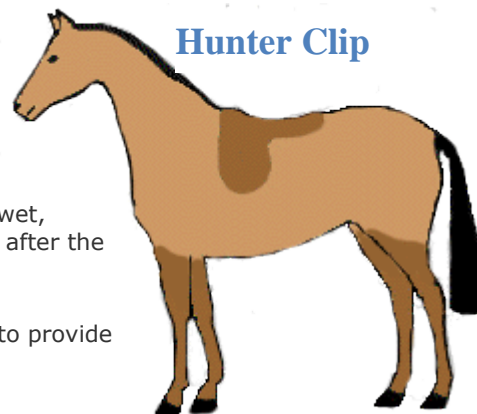
The Canvas or New Zealand Rug is designed to protect a horse from wind and rain. It is used mainly for horses that are out (not stabled) and in work, or for horses that live in cold weather climates. Traditionally made of canvas or flax, and lined, the rug is very warm and weatherproof.

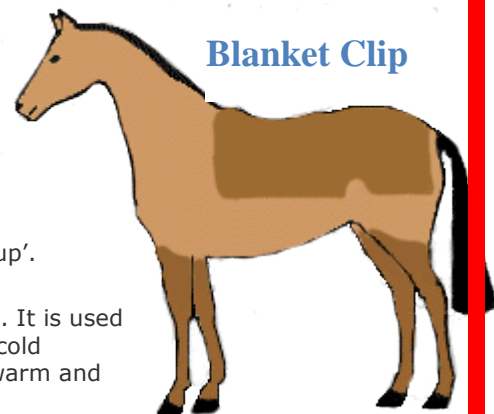

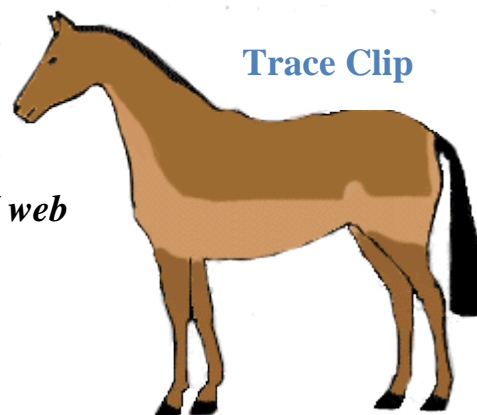
Hunter Clip
