How does the duty roster work?

These are the expectations for families on duty:

Canteen The duty families are to run the canteen all day, starting from 8:30 (winter) 7:30 (summer). There are instructions provided in the canteen area, and one of the canteen supervisors will be available at the start of the day to deliver food, get things going, and answer any questions. There is usually some time during the day for families to share staying inside, and being outside watching the rally, and they should roster this between themselves. It is usually "all hands on deck" just prior to and during the busy lunch period.

Outdoors Setup Duty families are responsible for setting up and packing up at the rally, and this means that one parent needs to be outside most of the day, starting from 8:30 (winter) 7:30 (summer). If there is more help needed during setup, the duty family should organise a call over the loud speaker for more help. There will usually be a supervisor available to provide direction (usually Jim or Roz).

Canteen end of day Duty families are responsible for the clean up of canteen, toilets and club rooms at the end of the day. Roster families also need to take home that day's garbage as we don't have a garbage collection at the club.

Outdoors Pickup Duty families are responsible for organising the pack up of outdoors areas at the end of the rally day. However ALL FAMILIES are required to assist them. Stay in touch with instructors and with the DC to find out when rings can be packed up, and put announcements over the loud speaker to get other families involved if needed.

Changes to the roster?

As we no longer have a specific person organising roster, it is YOUR responsibility to organise a swap if needed, and to let Wendy Wright know so she can change the information in the newsletter/web site. The information that we have published above is to the best of our knowledge - if you don't tell us about changes, we won't know to make the change.

End of day pack up

The pack up of equipment in each ring/arena is to be done by ALL FAMILIES at the rally on the day.

If everyone pitches in, the ring pack up can be done very quickly - more hands make light work!

Reminder regarding fees ...

Annual Fees Pony Club fees for 2012/13 are now overdue. You should have received your invoice, which has details of how to make payment. If you are still to pay, please do so to Sue Tucker at the next rally. Payment is required prior to riding at May rally.

- August Trail Ride – Due to wet winters and wanting to look after our grounds, we have had a rally "off-site" in the past. We have organised a trail / navigation ride on the Warby Trail the last two years and previous to that, used Wandin Park for a rally. This year we have two options so far
 1. Willow Lodge Trail Rides – located in Somerville. This place has been running trail rides for over 10 years and just last month closed the business. They are now offering use of their facilities to groups who want to come on their own. There are tie-up areas, yards, toilets and BBQ facilities so we can make a whole day of it.

ast facts ...

Horse Trials (HT), also known as "Eventing", are also known as One, Two or Three Day Events, Horse Trials consists of three phases: Dressage, Cross Country & Show Jumping

State Horse Trial Championships are preceded by individual qualifying competitions

Grade 1 and 2 riders are eligible to compete

To qualify, Grade 2 horse/rider combinations must have competed without elimination (and no more than 60 penalties) at three HT's in the preceding 12 months

The location of the State Champs is rotated amongst each of the Victorian zones

A new XC course is built for each State Champs, to ensure no rider has the advantage of having ridden it before.

Deniliquin is in NSW, but along with a number of other "border towns" is part of the Victorian Pony Club organisation

The Howes & Wrights made the trip to Deniliquin on Friday, setup camp on the pony club grounds, and prepared for an interesting weekend. With three separate grade 2 sections, we were pleased that Mooroolbark's riders were not competing against each other. After dressage on Saturday morning, **Lauren & Kal** were coming equal fourth in their section, **Jackie & Tetley** about 11th, and **Jackie & Tommy** were not coming last

(actually about 17th out of 25)! A walk of the cross-country in the afternoon was an eye-opener ... designed to flow through the bush on river flats, it was a very interesting but challenging course. Not only were the jumps themselves very technical, there were also plenty of opportunities to get lost, with tracks criss-crossing each other, and many of the jumps not visible through the trees until you were close to them.

After a chilly night (1 on the thermometer in the morning), and a bit of a hold-up while the course designers figured out what to do about sun glare on the water jump (nothing as it turned out), the cross country got under way, with the challenges of the course

bringing about lots of penalties and eliminations amongst competitors.

Jackie & Tommy were the first of our group to tackle the course. In his usual speedy and springy way, he went clear around the whole course, only showing a little (and understandable as far as I'm concerned) hesitation at the drop. **Lauren & Kal** were next, getting around the course with two refusals. **Jackie & Tetley** were next, but Tetley had decided the excitement was all too much, and after a lot of work from Jackie to keep his mind on the job, he completely refused the drop and they were eliminated.



The showjumping phase was almost an anti-climax after the XC excitement, with all horses performing well. **Jackie & Tommy** finished the day in 10th place, a fantastic result for them.

Use of the club grounds

All members can use the club grounds at any time except the second Saturday (11.30am to 4pm) when the Yarrambat Adult Riding Club (YARC) has their rally.

If you do not have a key, please see Jo Rogneda (our uniform coordinator) at a rally and with a \$50 deposit she will supply you with a key.

Please note only Yarrambat members can use the grounds.

If you are approached by a rider who is not from our club who would like to have access to the grounds you need them to ring Dennis or Karen Kerr (AH 9717 3709) to organize this access. Under no circumstances can you give a non-member access. They are not covered by our insurance.

The committee sets the rules about the use of the grounds. The current rules for non-member access is that

1. the person requesting the access must come through Karen Kerr to book a day & time
2. only groups under an instructor can gain access
3. there is a cost per rider for this access
4. the riders have to complete a form before they ride.
5. through the process of booking the access Karen will inform the organizer of any issues associated with the grounds and other about other riders who may be present.

The key reasons for these rules are:

1. the club has to provide a safe environment for all riders. Someone from outside the club will not be aware of any issues associated with the grounds (for example dangerous areas)
2. the club has invested (along with YARC) approximately \$30,000 into the cross country over the last 3 years. The money earned by non-members paying to access the grounds helps to maintain our facility.
3. An instructor will ensure that riders train safely over the jumps at their correct level.

These rules are discussed and reviewed regularly. If you have any concerns about access to the grounds or other riders wanting to use the grounds then please let the Committee know.
